## **Phonics Screening Results 2017:**

**72%** of pupils in Y1 in the academic year 2016-17 achieved the expected standard.

81% achieved the standard Nationally (2016).

**Y2 Phonics data for 2017:** Y1 (2016) and Y2 (2017) combined => **95.6%** of children achieved the phonics standard by the end of Y2 (2016 **82.6% of Y1** achieved the standard and of those who were retested in 2017 **75%** of children who were Working Towards (Wt) in Y1 achieved standard in Y2).
