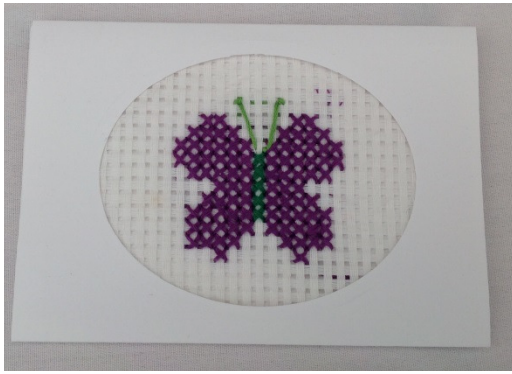
### in Class 5

We painted pebbles for the WW1 Memorial Service at church, in remembrance of those who gave up their lives in the name of peace.

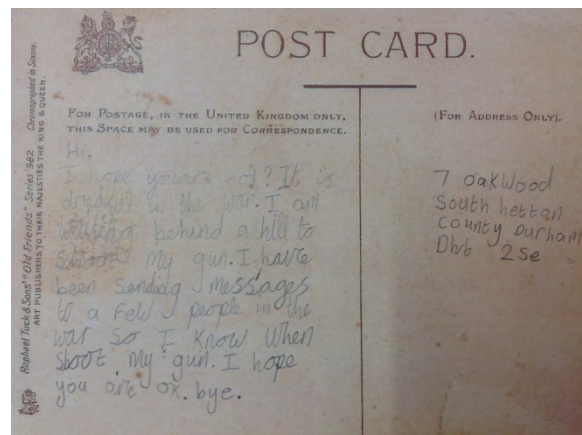
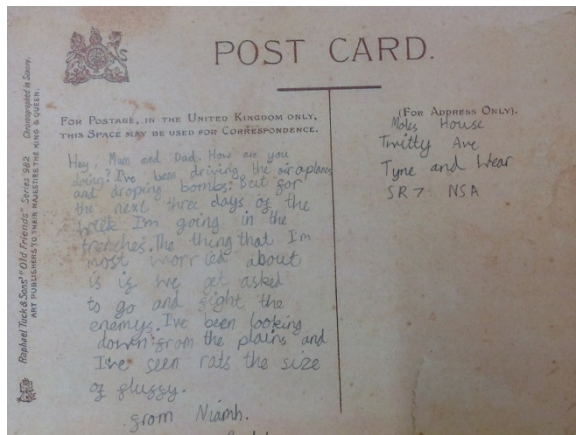


We designed and produced our own poppies from card.
