Year 1 Home Learning Tasks W.B: 15.06.2020

Hello Year 1,

Well done for some wonderful work last week and thank you to all of you who have uploaded tasks to Class Dojo. Please do continue to do this regularly and keep in touch!

For this week:

This week we are looking at a story called 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. I will share the story with you on Class Dojo on Monday morning so that you have a copy to read! We will be doing a few different activities based on this book!

Suggested Structure:


Monday – Read and familiarizes with the story with your child. Identify the adjectives (describing words) in the book that describe Mr Grinling's lunch. Write about or draw your own favourite meal and think of as many adjectives as possible to describe it!

Tuesday – Re-read this week's story focusing on the days of the week! It is a requirement in the Year 1 curriculum to be able to sequence and spell the days of the week – so that is our focus today! List the days of the week in the correct order and try your best to spell them! Next write a sentence of brief description of what happened in the story on each day.

Wednesday – Eventually, Mr and Mrs Grinling try to put food in the picnic basket that the seagulls won't like! Today I would like you to write your own silly recipe for 'Seagull Scaring Sandwiches'. There are some templates/prompts later in this document that I can share with you on Class Dojo too. Don't worry about printing these, you can write straight in to your writing books.

Thursday – Today we will look at healthy eating plate and talk about the importance of a balanced diet. I will share resources on this via Class Dojo. Your writing task today is to write a healthy menu for Mr Grinling's Picnic!

Friday – Write a post card from Mr Grinling telling others what has happened and how he solved the problems! Pretend you are Mr Grinling when writing and don't forget to use personal pronoun 'I'. The word mat below may be useful!


Computing Challenge.


Just like our rainbows a couple of weeks ago, can you use the Paint program on your computer or device to draw and decorate a lighthouse?
