I have enjoyed seeing your work on the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch! This week we are going to work on a story called 'The Snail and The Whale' by Julia Donaldson! I hope you enjoy this book and please do keep sharing your super work on Class Dojo to earn your points!

Suggested Structure:

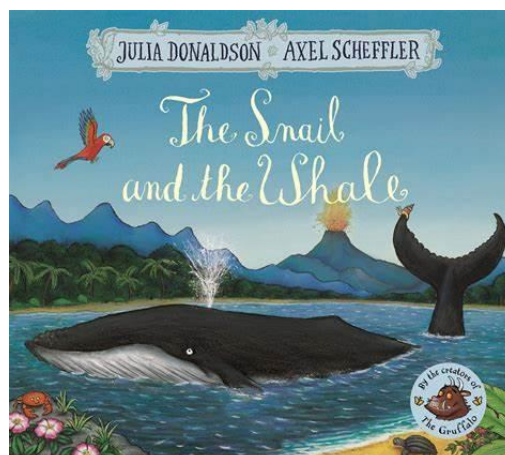
Monday – Read the story and get to know what happens! You will hear all about 'The Amazing Travelling Snail' using the prompts on the template below, can you draw and describe all of the places that the Snail visited on the adventure?

Tuesday – Re-read this week's story. Yesterday we wrote all about the Snail's adventure. Today the Snail would like to say thank you to the Whale for all of the travelling, use the prompts on the template below to write a thank you letter to the Whale.

Wednesday – Now that the Snail has said thank you to the Whale, the Snail would like somewhere new to travel. Can you think of a new animal that the Snail can travel with? Write about where the new animal and the Snail travel to next and what they see. You can be as creative as you like on this one!

Thursday – In the story a rock is described as being as 'black as soot'. This is a simile, where you say something is like something else. Can you find any other similes in the story? Can you write some of your own? Or for a challenge you can try and find some similes in other books!

Friday – I hope you have enjoyed reading 'The Snail and The Whale' this week. What was your favourite part of the story? Draw a picture of your favourite part and write about what happened.
