Each day I will continue to add another Daily Challenge linked to other areas of our learning around the topic of 'Seasides'. This week we will be getting creative and also completing a Science task.


Keep up the super efforts I have seen over the past weeks and don't forget to keep me updated with your learning on Class Dojo!


#### <u>Maths</u> –

This week our learning is more of a little project linked to Geography and History


with some writing tasks to complete to show what you have learnt. You will need to complete some research and at the end of the week I would like you to create a leaflet about a chosen seaside town.

- What are the usual features of a seaside town?




Label the features on the photo of a seaside town.

  - Physical Features A feature that has been formed naturally (humans didn't build it)



Sunbathing wasn't in fashion back then, so the Victorians would go to the beach fully clothed. 'Sea bathing' was done instead.

Beaches were a lot cleaner back then as there weren't as many packaged foods and snacks.




Choose one of the seaside towns from the map you saw above. Find out all of the exciting things they have on offer.

- Does it have any exciting history?




• Using your research, I would like you to create a Tourist Information Leaflet to encourage someone to visit the seaside town.
