# Suggested English Activities:

(All activities do not need a writing template and should be written straight in to a book).

This week in your writing, I would like your focus on rhyming and repeated refrains.

The main aim when writing a poem is to make sure it has a good flow, rhyming words and ideas that link together, related to your theme of Summer.

Use the school log in provided on Class Dojo. Select, Key Stage One, English and then Poetry. I will direct you to useful things on here throughout the week, but to start look at the videos and listen to some of the poems for some inspiration. I will share any additional resources needed on Class Dojo during the week.

- Listen to Espresso poems. Brainstorm your ideas about Summer, think of the weather, activities, memories, signs of summer, summer foods etc. List all of ideas about Summer that you could include in a poem.
- Rhyming Access Espresso or Phonics Play rhyming games. Practise making rhymes using these games. Look back at your work from yesterday, select words about summer and see if you can make any summer rhymes.
- Summer Acrostic Poem Write down the word 'Summer' think of your ideas about Summer and create an acrostic poem.
- Use all of your ideas from the week to construct a summer poem, make sure it includes some of your summer rhyming words.

# <u>History Project -Transport Continued -The History of Trains!</u>


This week to finish our History project, we will focus on the history of Trains and significant individual George Stephenson.

I will share information and resources with you about George Stephenson and trains on Class Dojo.


# Activity Ideas:
