




<u>English</u>

This week we are continuing to look at the seaside. I have included some activities focusing on the alphabet and some lovely poetry activities for you to complete.

<u>Activities —</u>

Seaside Alphabet Challenge Can you come up with a seaside themed word for each letter of the alphabet?



You don't need to print this out and can write it straight into your writing book.





• Can you put these seaside words in alphabetical order? Use the alphabet strip to help you if you need it. I have written two lists; the second one is a little trickier as some words begin with the same letter so you will need to look at the second letter as well to help you order them



- Rhyming Words in lots of poems and books we find rhyming words. Can you read the words below and write as many different words that you can think of that rhyme with them? Example: sand, hand, band etc.
 - o tide
 - o hat
 - o <mark>sea</mark>
 - o shell
 - o hut

• Read the poem below. Can you find the rhyming words? Can you think of any more words that rhyme with the ones in the poem?



Which words are nouns? (names)


Which words are verbs? (doing/action words)

Which words are adjectives? (descriptive words)

 Use the words from the poem and what you now know about the seaside to create your own seaside acrostic poem. Write your poem straight into your writing book and remember to make your nouns sound better using adjectives!



• Have a look at the photos of the sea shells below. Can you think of some adjectives to describe them? Think about the shape, the smell, the colour and the texture (how they might feel). You might have some of your own shells at home to help you think of even more adjectives.



• Use your ideas to write a poem about the shells. Each line needs to have two adjectives in it to describe the shell.

Example: A spiky stripy shell. A smooth shiny shell.

• Do you remember what a verb is? I would like you to make a list of activities you like to do at the beach. Your verbs need to end in '-ing'

Example: running jumping laughing

• Using your list of verbs write a poem about what you like to do at the beach. Your poem needs to start and end with the line, 'I love everything at the beach'

Example:

I love everything at the beach. Running into the freezing sea.

Eating delicious fish and chips. Laughing with my friends. I love everything at the beach.

(Try to make your poem longer and more exciting than mine too!)

• Think of the sand on the beach. How could you describe the sand? Use the ideas to write a poem about the sand using three different adjectives in each line.

Example: Sand, sand, sand. Itchy, yellow, wet sand. Thick, squelchy, cold sand. Hot, dry, gritty sand. Sand, sand, sand. Read the poem by Jennifer Tweedie below.

Ocean Travel

If I could travel the oceans blue, these are the things that I would do:

Fly with puffins under the sea. Dive with seagulls. Fish for my tea.

Cling to the tail of a rolling whale. Leap with dolphins in a buffeting gale.

Soar with an eagle. Hunt with a shark. Frolic with seals. Fly home before dark. Can you write your own version of the poem? Think of all the sea creatures and other animals you might see on your ocean journey and what you would do with them.


Example:

If I could travel the ocean blue These are the things that I would do.

> Wrestle with a squid. Dive with the dolphins. Etc.

• Using what you know about the animals at the seaside and verbs I would like you to write one more poem called 'Swimming in the ocean what did I see.'

Example: Swimming in the ocean what did I see? I saw a jellyfish wriggling at me. Swimming in the ocean what did I see? I saw a crab pinching at me. Swimming in the ocean what did I see? I saw a shark showing his teeth at me.
