

GEOGRAPHY



Our first topic was Mountains and we really go to know how to use an atlas during this topic. In class we found mountain ranges and information on the height by using the index pages. One of our favourite parts of this topic was looking at how different mountains are formed and the names that are given to them.

Next we looked at volcanoes and earthquakes. In this topic we looked at the layers of the earth and we are able to identify the crust, mantle, outer core and inner core. We then went on to look at how volcanoes are formed and how the tectonic plates float on top of the mantle. We really enjoyed looking at where volcanoes are in the world and we focused on how the world is made up of two hemispheres and that the equator divides the world into these. We explored the features of a volcano and were able to name and identify them. Investigating 'The Ring of Fire' was fascinating and we were amazed to see how many volcanoes and earthquakes were found in these areas because of the tectonic plate boundaries.
